We know that college students want to study abroad,¹ yet only 10% of students study abroad before they graduate. HIGHER GRADUATION RATES

Four-year graduation rates are **18% HIGHER** for students who study abroad.³

Senator Paul Simon Study Abroad Program Act

NAFSA has long advocated for a federal study abroad grant program to incentivize colleges and universities to remove the barriers that keep students from studying abroad. The Senator Paul Simon Study Abroad Program Act would pursue four key objectives:

ENSURE

at least **1,000,000 students**
study abroad every year.

INCREASE

the **diversity of students** studying abroad to reflect
the undergraduate population.

ENCOURAGE

a greater portion of study abroad to occur in
nontraditional study abroad locations.

STRENGTHEN

the **commitment of colleges and universities**
to expand study abroad opportunities.

We urge Congress to **pass the Senator Paul Simon Study Abroad Program Act** and make *meaningful study abroad opportunities a reality* for all college students.
